almost thirty years, and I can tell you that he truly values what ATO did for him. I value having been a part of his ATO experience.

Tom graduated in mechanical engineering and entered the world of

technology and business, eventually holding senior management positions while at Dunn and Bradstreet Software. A visionary entrepreneur at heart, Tom and Chris Klaus launched Internet Security Systems, Inc. (ISS) in early 1995. Their goal was to develop and provide security management systems for e-business. It worked. (He worked!) ISS grew and prospered under his leadership. Today, ISS is one of the largest and most widely recognized network security providers in the world. Tom is its chairman, president and chief executive officer. We're very proud of him and his accomplishments.

Tom has stepped forward again to help Beta Iota and provide the leadership we need to make the chapter strong and financially stable. He has made a challenge gift of over \$55,000 through the ATO Foundation both to retire short-term (nonmortgage) debt and to install a library and computer center in the "old dining room" of the chapter house. His challenge to you is to move forward with him by making gifts to help retire our short-term renovation debt of \$200,000.

There is more good news associated with his leadership gift. When the library is completed, we will qualify for an additional \$100,000 in "educationally qualified" costs from the house renovation. This means that **Tax Deductible** gifts made to the ATO Foundation can be channeled back to Beta Iota to further reduce the aforementioned \$200,000 short-term debt.

Many of you have told me when we started raising funds for the house that tax-deductibility was an important issue. So, now we have a way of putting a big dent in our problem, since the first \$100,000 of additional gifts can be tax-deductible.

Jack Hamilton '66 and I will begin calling soon asking for these gifts. Many of you said to let you know if we needed more help. Here is your opportunity.


